

Dollar General Corporation Chemical Policy

Dollar General is committed to offering for sale only those products that meet or exceed applicable legal and regulatory requirements, including those relating to product and environmental safety. Where practicable and in keeping with the Company's obligation to create long-term value for its shareholders, the Company will endeavor to go beyond what is required by law and take additional steps to reduce or eliminate certain intentionally added high priority chemicals (the "Chemicals") from its private brand formulated products (the "Products") in certain departments (the Departments"). These Chemicals will be posted on its Restricted Substances List ("RSL").

The Chemicals included on the Company's RSL are:

- Bromopropane
- Asbestos
- 1,4-dioxane
- Cyclic Aliphatic Bromides Cluster of Flame retardants (HBCD)
- Octamethylcyclotetrasiloxane (D4)
- Lead and Lead Compounds
- Cadmium and Cadmium Compounds
- Bisphenol A (BPA)
- Diethyl Phthalate
- Dibutyl Phthalate
- Tetrachloroethylene (PERC)
- Butylparaben
- Formaldehyde
- Nonylphenol Ethoxylates
- Propylparaben
- Toluene
- Triclocarban
- Trichloroethylene
- Triclosan
- OECD's per and poly-fluoroalkyl substances (PFAS)

The Products and Departments covered by this policy are:

- Home Cleaning: private brand formulated products
- Beauty & Personal Care: private brand formulated products
- Hardware: private brand formulated cleaning products
- Automotive: private brand formulated cleaning products

In furtherance of our Chemical Policy, the Company has taken or intends to take the following actions:

- Encourage all suppliers (i) to reduce or eliminate Chemicals included on the Company's RSL and/or (ii) employ safer alternatives (i.e., those identified by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's Safe Choice program)
- Require the elimination of OECD's PFAS from Products in the covered Departments by fiscal year end 2026
- Enhance the collection of chemical composition data for the Products in covered Departments by requiring suppliers to register their product formulations with UL Solutions' WERCSmart® system and provide the Company with access to such data
- Review and evaluate the Chemicals, Products and Departments covered by this policy on an annual basis referencing information provided by WERCSmart® system
- Encourage suppliers of Products in covered Departments to improve transparency with consumers regarding the ingredients in their products
- Participate in the Chemical Footprint Project Survey
